CONSTITUTION

We, the Alumni of the Messiah Bible School and Missionary Training Home, grateful for the benefits of Christian education, in order to form a closer union of the graduates of the School, to promote the best interests of our Alma Mater, and to perpetuate the Christian spirit which has always been so vital a part of her life, do hereby establish the following Constitution.

ARTICLE I. Name

Section 1. This association shall be known as the ALUMNI ASSOCIATION OF THE MESSIAH BIBLE SCHOOL AND MISSIONARY TRAINING HOME OF GRANTHAM, PENNSYLVANIA.

ARTICLE II. Membership

Section 1. The Alumni Association shall consist of the graduates of the School.

Section 2. The graduates of each succeeding year shall be formally re-

ceived as members of the Association at some meeting during Commencement Week.

ARTICLE III. Officers

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be President, Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and Treasurer, who together shall constitute the Executive Committee.

Section 2. The officers shall be elected at the regular annual business meeting of the Association, and shall continue in office for the term of one year.

ARTICLE IV. Duties of Officers

Section 1. The duties of the President, Vice President, and Treasurer shall be such as are generally understood to appertain to these officers.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the Recording Secretary to keep a faithful record of the proceedings of the Association, and a continued list of the names, residences, and occupations of all the members thereof.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary to keep in touch with the Alumni of the Messiah Bible School, and to do such other corresponding as the needs of the Association may demand.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to perform such general duties as do not fall to the lot of any one officer to make all necessary preparations for the annual public meeting, and to publish an annual bulletin in the interests of the Association.

ARTICLE V. Meetings.

Section 1. The regular annual business meeting of the Association shall be held on Tuesday of Commencement Week, immediately following the Class Day exercises.

Section 2. On Tuesday evening of Commencement Week, there shall be held a public meeting, the main feature of which shall be an address on some subject of general educational interest.

ARTICLE VI. Finances

Section 1. The annual dues shall be twenty-five cents. Money needed beyond the amount of annual dues shall be raised by voluntary contributions.

Section 2. At each regular business meeting the Treasurer shall give a report of the condition of the treasury.

ARTICLE VII. Quorum

Section 1. Ten shall constitute a quorum to transact business, but a smaller number shall have power to do business requiring immediate attention when more cannot be brought together.





ARTICLE VIII. Amendments

Section 1. This constitution may be amended by a three-fourths vote of the members present, provided the ten or more are present.
